

Links to other environmental social action projects

There are lots of social action projects that already exist that you might like to get involved with.

Each of these projects provides a meaningful way for you to get involved in conservation and environmental action. We've put together a list of projects that are accessible and can be tailored to different interests and skills.

1 Local clean-up campaigns

Organise or participate in clean-up events to remove litter from local parks, beaches, rivers or neighbourhoods.

- Mark: Reduces pollution, protects wildlife, and promotes community pride.

2 Tree planting initiatives

Lead or join tree planting events in your community or school to help increase green spaces and combat deforestation.

- **Impact:** Enhances local air quality, provides wildlife habitat and helps reduce climate change.

3 Wildlife conservation awareness campaigns

Create and share educational materials or social media content to raise awareness about endangered species and conservation efforts.

4 Community gardens and urban agriculture

Start or participate in community gardens or urban agriculture projects to promote sustainable food practices and green spaces.

5 Recycling and waste reduction programmes

Organise recycling events/workshops on waste reduction techniques to promote recycling and minimise waste in your community.

6 Beach and river clean-up events

Participate in or organise events focused on cleaning up beaches or riverbanks to address pollution and protect aquatic ecosystems.

- **Impact:** Improves water quality, protects marine life and enhances the beauty of natural areas.

7 Energy conservation awareness

Lead workshops or create campaigns to educate others about energy-saving practices and renewable energy sources.

- **Impact:** Reduces energy consumption, promotes sustainable living and decreases greenhouse gas emissions.

8 Environmental advocacy and policy engagement

Get involved in advocacy efforts to support environmental policies and legislation by attending meetings, writing letters, or participating in rallies.

- **Impact:** Influences policy decisions, supports changes in laws and amplifies the voice of the youth in conservation efforts.

9 Wildlife monitoring and citizen science

Participate in or organise citizen science projects that track local wildlife populations and environmental changes.

- ♠ Impact: Contributes to scientific research, monitors biodiversity and supports conservation initiatives.

10 Educational workshops and school clubs

Create or participate in workshops or school clubs at schools to teach friends about environmental issues, conservation methods and sustainable practices.

11 Advocacy for sustainable products and choices

Promote the use of sustainable and eco-friendly products through campaigns, social media or community events.

- Impact: Encourages responsible buying habits and supports businesses that prioritise sustainability.

12 Petitions and fundraising for conservation projects

Start or support petitions and fundraising campaigns to support conservation projects and environmental organisations.

13 Sustainable transportation initiatives

Promote or participate in initiatives that encourage the use of public transportation, biking or carpooling to reduce carbon emissions.

- **Memory** Reduces traffic congestion, lowers greenhouse gas emissions and supports a sustainable transportation network.

14 Other changemaking initiatives

Get involved with other projects focussed on taking social action for the environment, climate action and sustainability.

- Impact: There's always more changes to be made for a variety of issues. Putting emphasis on a different topic or finding new approaches to making change might have different effects. So why not get inspired to try different ways of changemaking.

1 The Wildlife Trusts - Junior Wildlife Champions

A programme for young people to engage in wildlife conservation activities, from habitat restoration to species monitoring.

2 Surfers Against Sewage - Beach Clean Campaigns

Volunteer for beach clean-ups and contribute to reducing marine pollution. They also offer educational resources and events

3 Friends of the Earth – My World My Home (16-24 year olds)

A network offering resources, campaigns and opportunities for young activists to engage in environmental justice and advocacy.

4 Chester Zoo - Youth Volunteering

Participate in various conservation tasks such as content creation, visitor engagements and research opportunities.

5 RSPB - Wildlife Explorers

Join an RSPB's local youth group to take part in conservation activities, wildlife monitoring and environmental education.

6 Young Reporters for the Environment (YRE)

A global programme with UK branches where young people create reports and campaigns on environmental issues to raise awareness.

7 Eco-Schools - Green Flag Award

Schools can join the Eco-Schools programme to engage in environmental projects and achieve the Green Flag Award for their sustainability efforts.

8 The Conservation Volunteers (TCV) - Green Gym

Participate in outdoor conservation work while improving physical fitness. Activities include habitat management and community gardening.

9 City Nature Challenge - UK Events

Participate in the City Nature Challenge, a global citizen science event where people record and document local wildlife.
